

SIZE AND SCOPE

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 12,156 (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2009-10) and 19,520 in noncredit enrollments.

STUDENT COSTS

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$3,686

Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$8,136

Per credit charge of \$146 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2011 is \$56 million, including state support of \$14.4 million and \$19 million in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY10, more than \$19.4 million in federal, state, and local funds was disbursed to 5,278 students. The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded an additional \$77,503 in scholarships and awards to 158 students and an additional \$44,455 in student loans to 215 students.

This year's highlights . . .

eHEALTHCAREERS

The Bristol Community College eHealthCareers is a public-private partnership with The Princeton Review to implement a new innovative and streamlined education model that will expand health education in the region and enable qualified students to get into the workplace faster.

Health education is expensive to provide and in most programs there are more qualified applicants than seats. eHealthCareers combines face-to-face and online learning opportunities for health science students and though private investment expands the number of students who can be prepared for high-demand careers.

Based at the New Bedford Campus, eHealthCareers includes private investment in infrastructure as well as training and professional development for faculty. Credit and noncredit degrees and certificates will be offered online to make the programs flexible, and the students will have the benefit of enhanced support, tutoring services, and career pathways that address labor shortages. The program will utilize innovative pedagogy, including online and face-to-face learning spaces.

Within three years, this program is expected to allow BCC to serve approximately 1,000 additional students.
