



THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS . . .

Bristol Community College celebrated its Golden Anniversary with the opening of the magnificent John J. Sbraga Health and Science Building. The 46,000-square-foot LEED Platinum* rated building is the largest Zero Net Energy classroom and science lab building in the Northeast. Zero Net Energy buildings produce enough renewable energy in the course of a year to meet the total amount of energy consumed by the building. This summer the College also marked the opening of the Bristol Community College Taunton Center at the Silver City Galleria. The newly reimaged space includes 12 classrooms, three computer labs, a casino lab for the College's newly

approved Associate in Applied Sciences in Hospitality Management, a high-tech biology and chemistry lab, and a certified nursing assistant lab. The opening is one of the first local examples of a national trend where shopping malls are being reimaged and converted to suit a variety of more sustainable community needs.

SIZE AND SCOPE

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 11,324 (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2015-16) and 15,580 in non-credit enrollments.

STUDENT COSTS

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$4,538

Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$9,482

Per credit charge of \$186 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2016 is \$72 million, including state support of \$20.7 million and \$30.7 million in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY16, more than \$27.6 million in federal, state, and local financial aid was disbursed to 6,889 students. In Fall 2016, 47% of students are receiving Pell Grants and 26% of students are receiving loans.

The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded \$244,283 in scholarships and awards to 291 recipients. The Foundation issued 121 loans totaling \$22,613 to assist students.




STUDENT PERSISTENCE SUCCESS RATE

Percentage of students who earned a degree or certificate, transferred, still enrolled, or earned at least 30 credits within six years.


HEADCOUNT INCREASE


